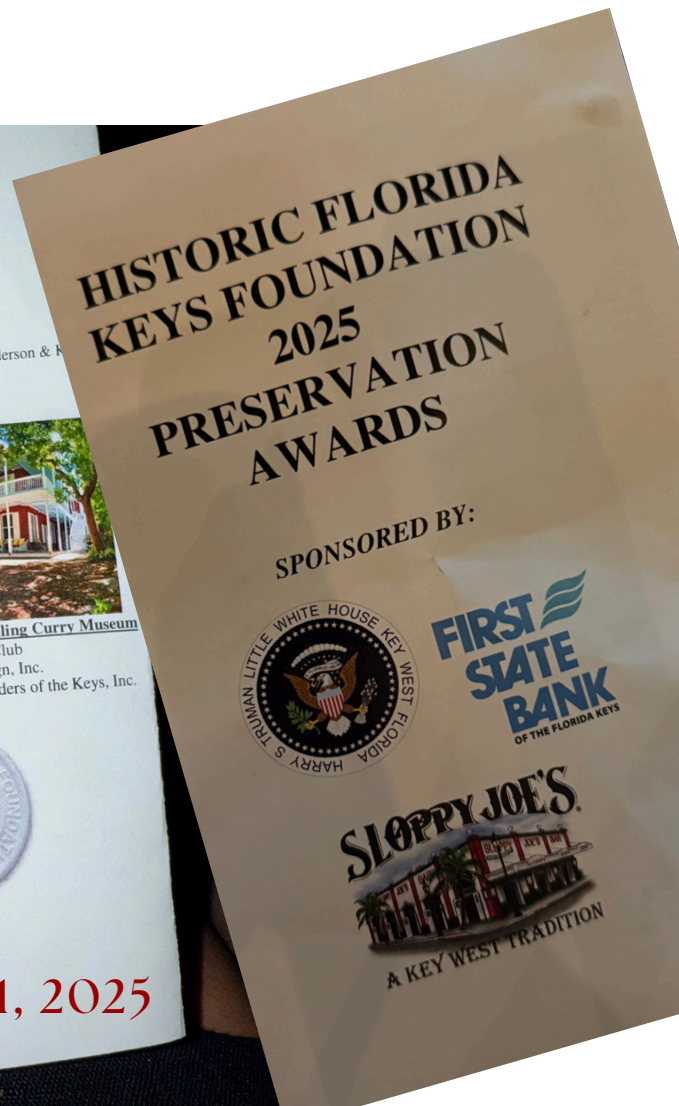
SAVING ELEANOR

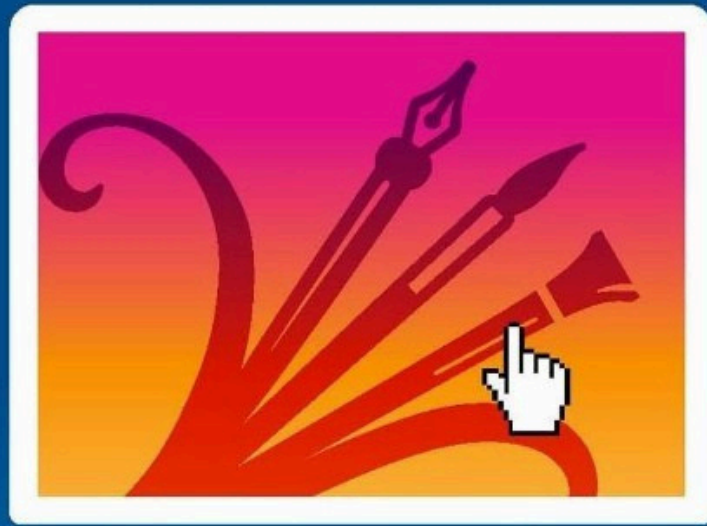
