


**CELEBRATING OUR HISTORY** 



The Woman's Club is very much encouraged over its list of entrants. Those who are participating in the contest for Better Gardens are serving the best interests of their home town through an effort to beautify their own home surroundings.

The club has decided not to close the contest definitely at any certain date, for the reason that people desiring to enter in the fall for the rest of the interval will have an opportunity to improve their grounds since that season is the planting season, and it is possible to make a marked transformation even in that brief length of time. The contest will officially commence the 10th of May however, and this long period is allowed so that those who are anxious to win prizes may have ample opportunity to carry out any extensive plan of beautification they may choose, and of course, would have the advantage of individuals who delay to enter until later. The only requisite is that the committee be notified at telephone 599 of any one's desire to enter. An immediate inspection is made, and that person's place is automatically registered on the list of competing gardens.

This contest is inaugurated through the generosity of Colonel Thompson, who intends to make his home in Key West and who believes that the city could be made to appear much more attractive and appealing to outsiders through a campaign of this nature. It was with the idea of improvement in mind that he offered to donate the money for the prizes, and the members of the club feel that it is now up to the people of Key West to demonstrate their appreciation of his confidence in their civic pride by entering the contest. One more bush, one more blossoming plant, is an improvement, a lawn can be begged from one's neighbor, if necessary, in procuring a "start" of Bermuda grass, which clutches at every pebble and soon covers a bare space, converting it into a greensward at once eye-commanding. Cuttings are swapped in Key West every day, it is stated, and if one doesn't have a pretty yard here it is due primarily to lack of interest, for it costs very little to get the "makings" for a beginning, and an hour every day devoted to its care will bring one both health and wealth of blossoms. has always been a month of new beginnings for the Key West Woman's Club. In 1926, members formally announced the Better Garden Contest, encouraging residents and schoolchildren to plant and care for their yards. Paired with the club's efforts to plant palms along the new **Over-Seas Highway**, it was one of our first major civic beautification projects, and it showed the island that women could lead the way in shaping Key West's future.

Just a year later, in **September 1927**, the club had taken an even bigger step by purchasing its first clubhouse, the Artolozaga residence on Division Street, for \$4,500. Membership grew rapidly, with more than 140 women joining that year! wow!! These September stories remind us that the women who came before us were visionaries. They planted, they built, and they grew, just as we continue to do today as stewards of Eleanor and champions for our community.

Did You Know We Have a Latin Motto? Yes we do.... And it's a powerful one too.



#### "Qui Non Proficit Deficit"

(pronounced: kwee non pro-FIH-kit DEH-fih-sit)

It means: "She/He who does not advance, falls behind." This phrase was adopted shortly after the Key West Woman's Club was founded in 1915. At the time, many civic and educational organizations chose Latin mottos to express ideals that felt timeless and grounded words that carried weight, purpose, and pride. Our founding members selected this one intentionally. Many of them were new to the island, like many of us, but deeply invested in its future. They saw Key West as a place worth fighting for, worth improving, and worth preserving. They believed that standing still was never an option and that women could and should be the driving force behind community progress. "Qui Non Proficit Deficit" became their guiding light. A call to action. A challenge to lead. A reminder that the work of women matters.

Since 1915, the Key West Woman's Club has been a place where women gather to do good for our island, our neighbors, and our shared history. Our original motto, still guides us. Only now, we like to say it in plain English:

"Women Get Things Done."


