

At one of the hardest moments in Key West's history, the Women of the Key West Woman's Club worked alongside city officials and the Red Cross to support our community. Our mission hasn't changed. We are, and always have been, a service organization, helping our community where the need is greatest. If you attended our Bougie Tea Event, you saw our mission in action. A huge thank you to our amazing Chairwomen, **Kathryn Norris** and **Patty Neyra**, and to everyone who purchased a ticket and supported the event. None of this wonderful work we do happens without you our dedicated volunteers. Thank you for everything you do, your time, your heart, and your commitment to this Club and our community.



Each month, we are proud to support other nonprofits that share our vision of a brighter, more caring Key West. By reinvesting in these causes, we are building a stronger future for everyone who calls this island home.

Here's who we're lifting up this month.

KWLC Softball Team: represents Key West High School with pride, grit, and island spirit. Known for strong fundamentals, teamwork, and competitive play, the Lady Conchs consistently showcase athletic excellence while embodying sportsmanship and school pride on and off the field.

Alex Vega Fire Museum: honors the legacy of the Key West Fire Department and the firefighters who have long protected our community. The museum preserves local history while recognizing the service, bravery, and commitment of Key West's fire families. Donations help keep this important piece of our island's story alive for future generations.

Anchors Aweigh Club Inc:

is a longstanding nonprofit recovery clubhouse in Key West that provides a safe meeting space for Alcoholics Anonymous, and offers a welcoming environment for people working toward sobriety and mutual support.

Key West Wildlife Center: a nonprofit wildlife rescue and rehabilitation facility dedicated to saving sick, injured, and orphaned native animals and returning them to the wild. They provide 24/7 rescue services and work year-round to protect and care for Florida Keys wildlife, relying on community support and donations to continue their lifesaving work.

Literacy Volunteers of America: a nonprofit organization that trains and supports community volunteers to tutor adults in reading, writing, and English language skills helping learners gain literacy, confidence, and opportunities for work, citizenship, and everyday life success.

THE HISTORY OF THE TROPICAL LUNCHEON

The **Tropical Luncheon** traces its roots back to the 1930s, when the Key West Woman's Club introduced the event as a winter-season fundraiser during the Great Depression. Even in difficult times, members believed in gathering with purpose, using the luncheon to support education, welfare programs, and civic projects throughout Key West.

By 1937, the **Tropical Luncheon** had become an established annual tradition. That year, when available facilities could not properly accommodate the event, the club made the decision not to hold the luncheon in its usual form. Instead, members hosted a supper at the Hospitality House on Duval Street.

Throughout the 1940s and 1950s, the **Tropical Luncheon** grew into one of the most anticipated events of the season. Known for its tropical décor, gracious hospitality, and strong community support, the luncheon played an important role in sustaining the club's charitable giving and the care of its historic home.

Nearly a century after it began, the Key West Woman's Club is proud to bring the **Tropical Luncheon** back on **February 8, 2026** honoring the generations of women who gathered before us to serve this island. From its earliest days to today, the Tropical Luncheon reflects the heart of our club bringing people together with purpose and tradition.


